

# Lulu's Moomba doll instructions

## step 1

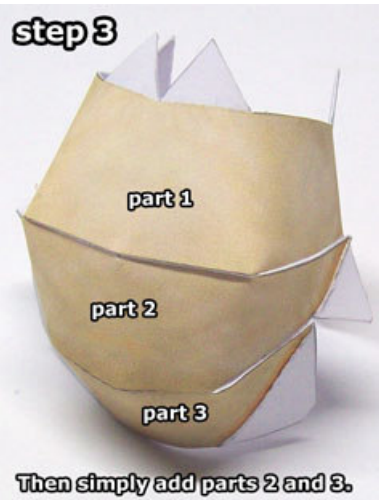


Besides these basic papercraft tools (and the parts of course! ) you can use anything you want to make assembling the model easier for you.

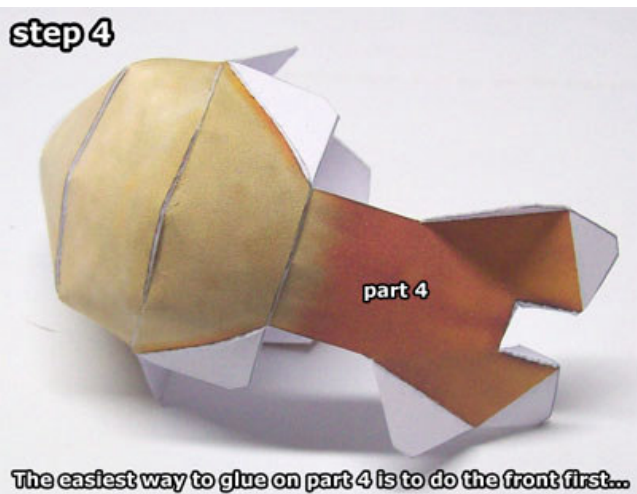

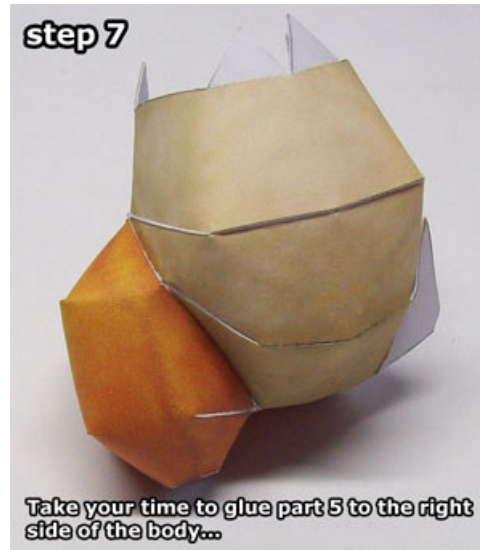


### step 6



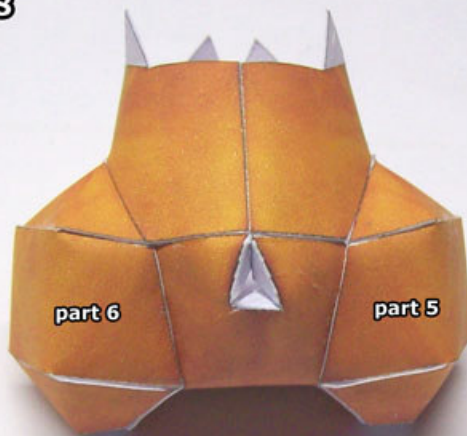
Part 5 may seem confusing at first, but if you first glue the glueing tab with the arrow, the shape becomes much more apparant.

### step 7



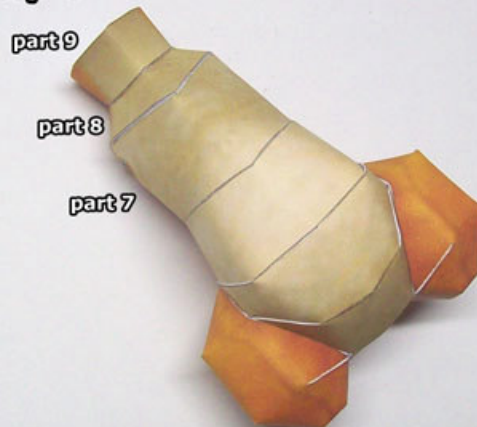
Take your time to glue part 5 to the right side of the body...

### step 8



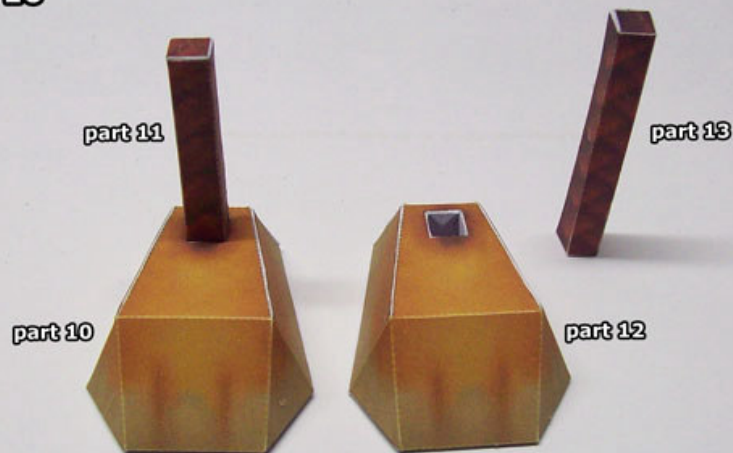
...and then part 6 to the left (view from the back, btw ;o)

### step 9



Now you can glue on parts 7-9; don't forget to cut a cross between the small, grey glueing tabs on part 7 so you can push them inwards!

### step 10



Assemble and glue together parts 10-13. Don't forget to cut a cross between the grey glueing tabs on parts 10 and 12, so you can glue parts 11 and 13 inside.

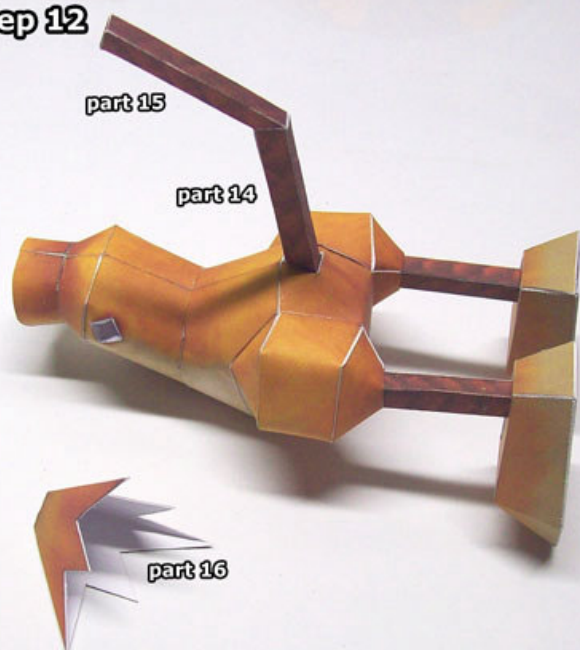


### step 11



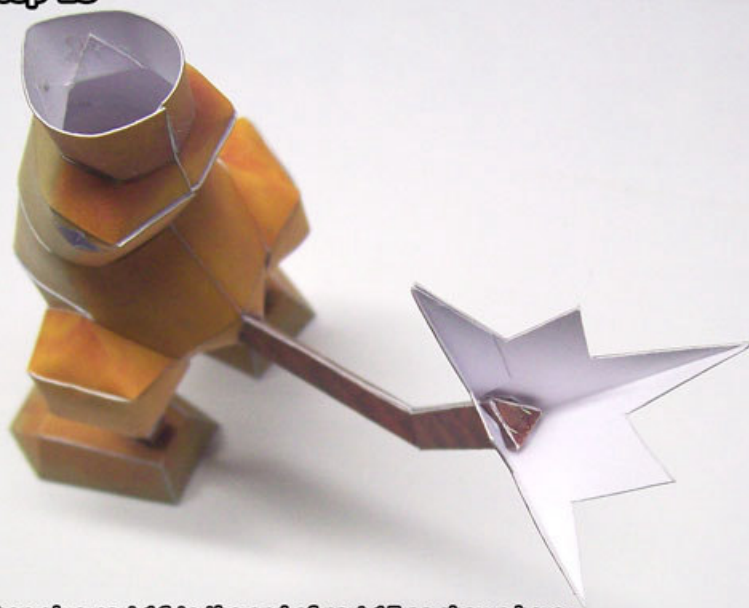
After glueing the bottom ends of the legs inside the paws, glue the tope end inside the hips.

### step 12



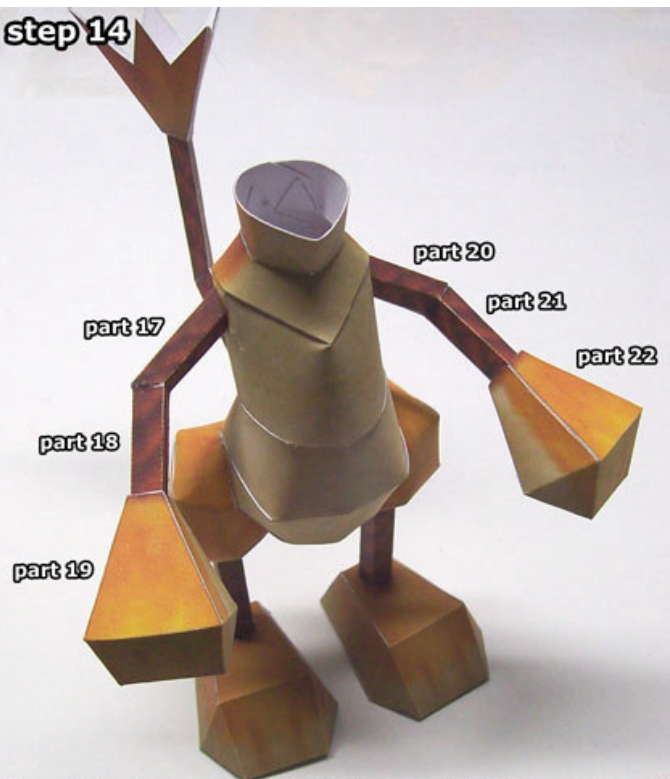
Assemble and glue together parts 14 and 15, and glue the end of part 14 inside the triangular hole on the Moomba's back. Also cut out and glue together part 16.

### step 13



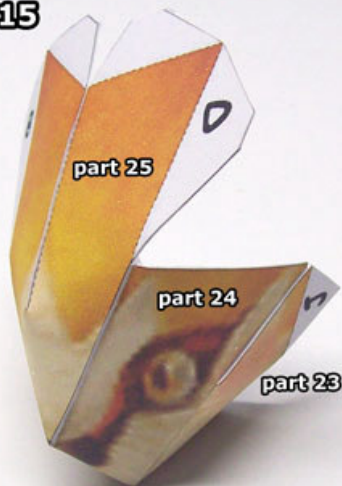
Then glue part 16 to the end of part 15 as shown here.

### step 14



Assembling the arms shouldn't be very difficult anymore. ;o)

### step 15



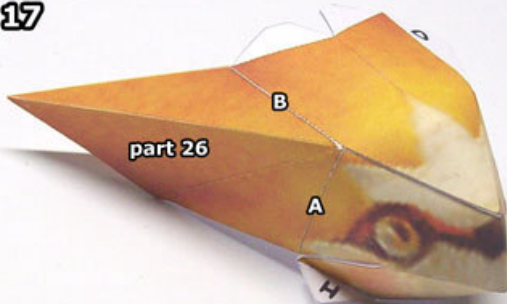
To build the head, start by glueing together parts 23-25.

### step 16



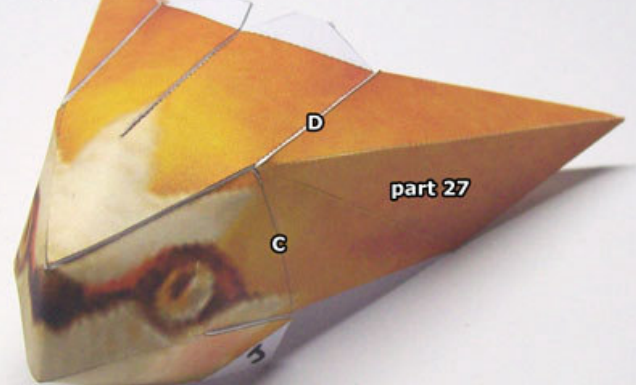
The "secret" to building the spiked hair, is to really build and glue on just 1 spike at a time. Score all the fold lines, cut out the part, and then the first thing you should do, is glue together the ends as indicated by the arrows. This will give the spike its shape.

### step 17



You will also notice the letters on the tabs and along the edges of the parts. They will help you figure out how to glue on each spike if the pictures don't help you enough. It may seem confusing at first, but if you just work on 1 spike at a time, it's a lot easier than you think.

### step 18



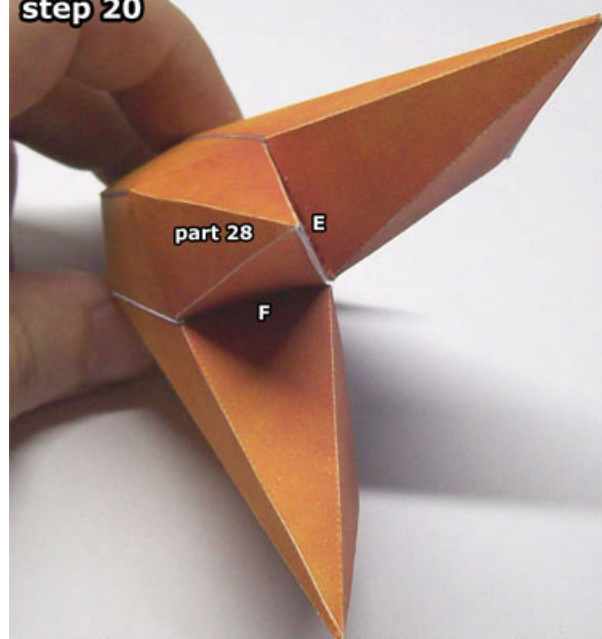
Do the same for part 27 on the other side.

This is what part 28 looks seperately...

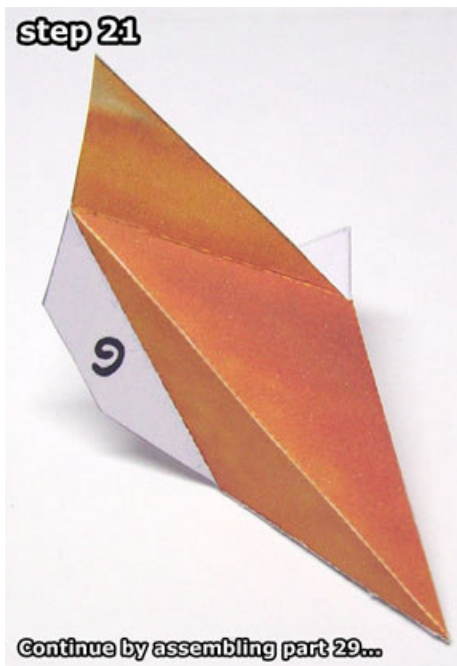
### step 20



...and this is how you should glue it to the rest of the head.

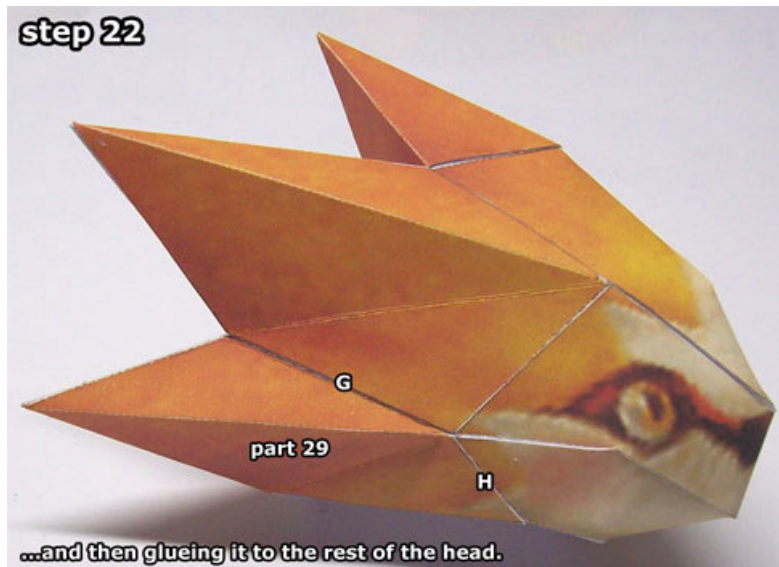

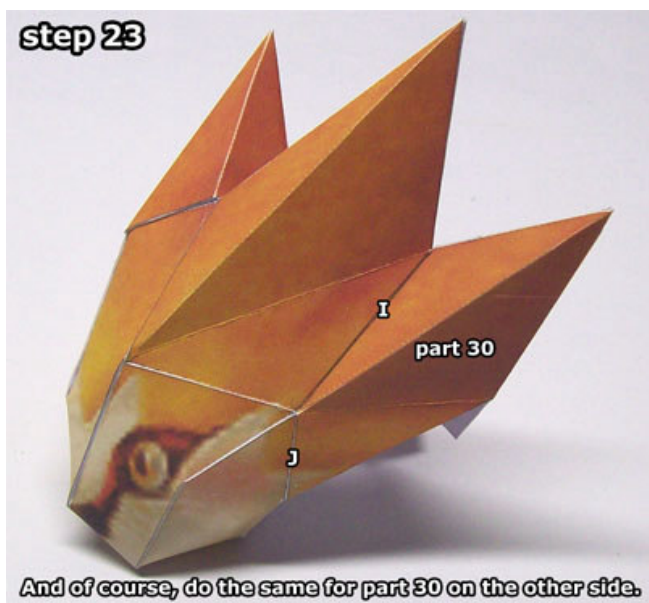
Continue by assembling part 29...

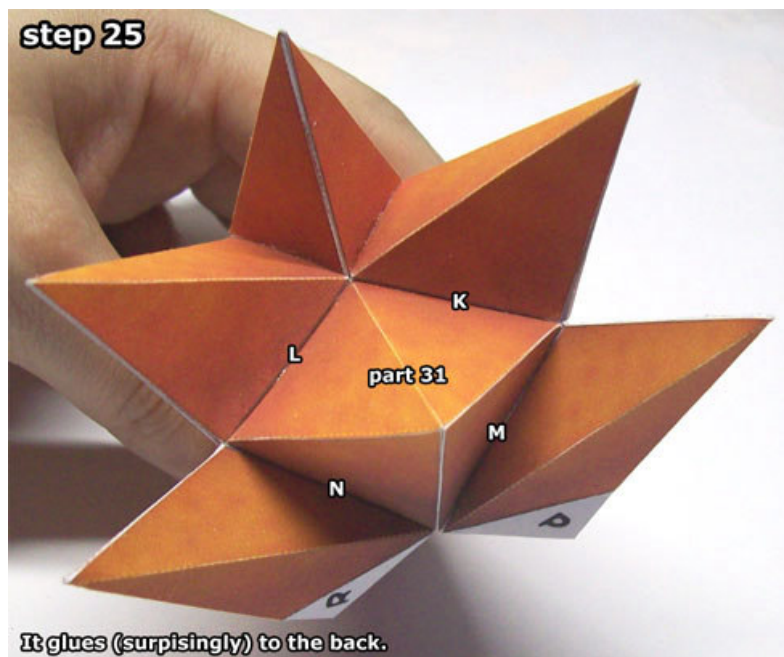
And of course, do the same for part 30 on the other side.

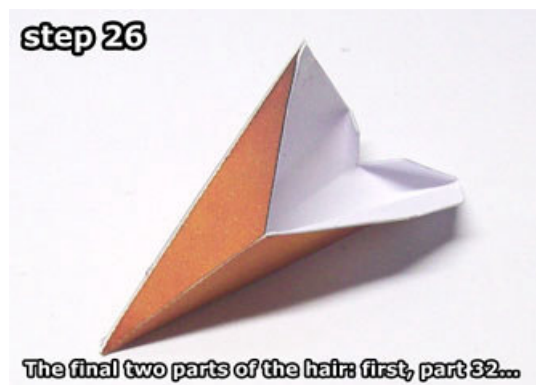
And now part 31, the back part of the hair.

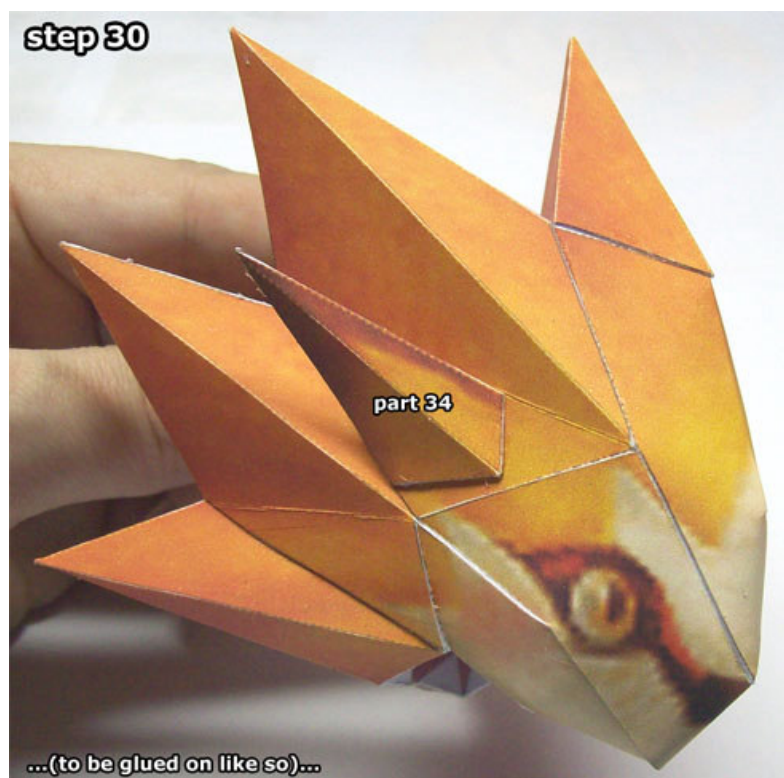
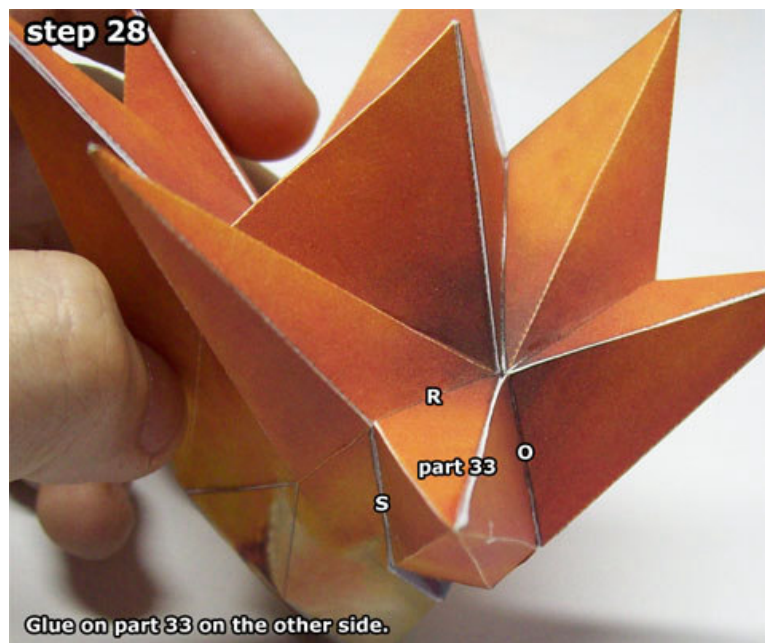
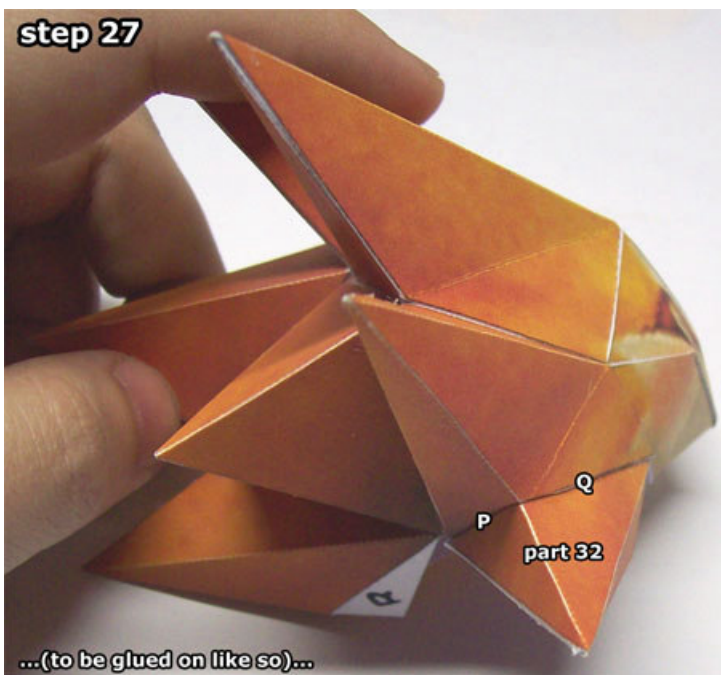


It glues (surprisingly) to the back.

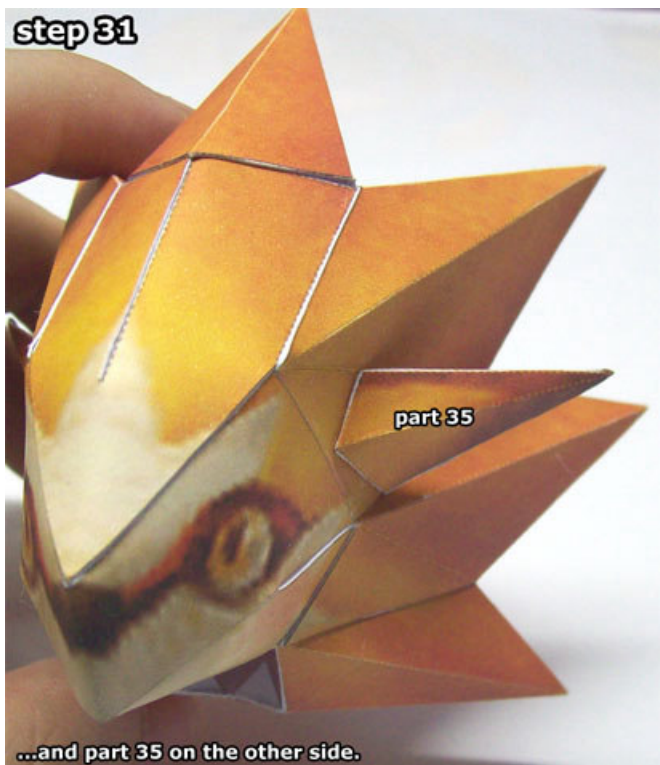


The final two parts of the hair: first, part 32...
